FOR CONVERSATION:

1. In 1 Samuel 2:1-10 is Hannah's prayer of praise to God for His fulfillment of her longing to bear a son (1 Samuel 1:10-11). Referring to 1 Samuel 1:17-20, describe this fulfillment and how it was unique to God's ability.
2. How did Hannah's prayer show recognition that God's attributes are His alone (1 Samuel 2:2-8)?
3. When reading v. 2:3, are you motivated to take on the values of God or those of the world? Why?
4. In 1 Samuel 2:3-8, what words of wisdom does Hannah offer from her personal experience? To whom was she referring?
5. Read vv. 2:1-10 and give some examples of God showing His sovereignty in human affairs. What reversals are spoken of, and why are they just?
6. Discuss how the struggles of life, particularly those that are eternally consequential, are not won by human strength or intellect, as Hannah learned, but ultimately by God's unmatched rulership. (1 Samuel 2:9-10, Exodus 15:6)
7. Although the powers and circumstances of this world may weigh heavily on us, who ultimately triumphs (1 Samuel 2:9-10)?
